## المخلص

تبحث هذه الرسالة في الاسباب التي تم بها الجمع بين المدن المصرية القديمة ذات المعاني و الدلالات الأسطورية والجنائزية مع بعضها البعض في كتاب الخروج الي النهار المعروف بكتاب الموتى المصري القديم، و الطريقه التي يتفاعل بها المتوفي شخصيا مع تلك المدن من منظور أوسع ، و الدور المركزي الذي لعبته هذه المدن في رحله المتوفي للعالم الاخر و دور آلهه العالم السفلي المرتبطه بهذه المدن في إعادة الميلاد.
