

The Sixth International Conference: Archaeology and Heritage: Authenticity, Risks and Challenges

Instructions to Authors

Research Title

The title should accurately and reliably reflect the subject of the research, and avoid using abbreviations in the title.

Researcher Name (s)

Write the name (s), affiliations, address, and e-mail. The corresponding researcher must be identified with an asterisk on his name or any other mark distinguishing him from the rest of the researchers. The main researcher must write his e-mail, mailing address and mobile phone number so that he can be contacted until the conference proceedings are printed.

Abstract

The abstract should not exceed 300 words. The word “Abstract” is bold, font size 12, font size is 12 for the text of the abstract, font type is New Time Roman, and the following should be considered:

- The abstract is a very small version of the research in its final form and must therefore be written very carefully.
- It should include a very brief summary of each section of the paper.
- Describes accurately what was done in the research with writing the problem of research and its objectives and different methods of tests and analyzes carried out.
- End the abstract by including conclusions.

Key words:

Include 3 to 7 words by placing a comma between each word and avoiding typing and - or other words.

Introduction

The introduction presents the research problems, the important work done in the field of research, solutions and concludes with the research objectives.

Materials and methods

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Materials (chemical or other) and methods (different treatment methods - tests - analyzes - etc.) that are used in the research paper should be described with precision.

Results and Discussion

The researcher accurately explains the results obtained from the research, interpretation and discussion.

Conclusions

The researcher describes the conclusions he found.

Acknowledgment

May be included or excluded

References

First: Writing the references in the text

The name of the author or researcher and the year of publication should be written inside the research body (eg, al-Baghdadi, 2005) (Harvard Style) without writing the reference at the bottom of the page. Footnotes at the bottom of the page are not allowed. All the references mentioned in the research text should be written in the bibliography, and all the references in the list should be referenced in the research table. Remember the following forms of references in the search text:

1. In case of reference to a research with a single author: write the name of the researcher and the year of publication.
2. In the case of research with two researchers: write the name of both researchers and the year of publication.
3. If there are more than one researcher, write the name of the first researcher and add the word "*et al.*" and add the year of publication.
4. In the case of reference to more than one reference and two different authors in a paragraph of the research board, the research should be organized in this case alphabetically and then remember the year of publication after each author or researcher.
5. In the case of reference to more than one reference but the same author in a paragraph of the research board, the research should be organized in this case alphabetically and then the publication year chronological order

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(from oldest to newest, or newer to oldest) but must follow one system throughout the paper.

Second: Writing references in the bibliography

The bibliography is arranged in alphabetical order at the end of the research. The references are as follows:

- References from Journals

The name of the researcher, the year of publication, the title of the research, the name of the journal, the number of the magazine, the number of the issue, the page numbers.

- References taken from monographs

Name of researcher - Year of publication - Title of the book - Edition number if any - Publishing House.

- Research from a chapter in a book

The name of the researcher (s) - the year of publication - the title of the chapter - the title of the book - the publisher- page numbers of the chapter.

Text

The font size of the paper is 13, and the font size is 14 and bold for the main section titles (introduction - materials and methods of work - results and discussion - conclusions - acknowledgment - bibliography) and the type of font is Time New Roman.

Figures

Figures or images should be numbered in the written text, and the image or figure must be at least 300 dpi and 600 dpi for line illustrations. In case of multiple images within the same figure, they should be marked 1, 2, 3 or A, B, C, D, and so on.

Tables

Tables should be numbered as indicated in the research. Tables mentioned in other research should not be used. The table heading must be placed above the table itself.

Language of writing the paper

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The research can be written in Arabic or English. In both cases, the paper should be linguistically correct. In case of writing in English, the writing method must be unified (either American or British, and not mixed).

Abbreviations

Abbreviations must be specified when they first appear in the research text.

Paper sections:

The paper should be divided into sections including the abstract, the introduction, materials and methods of work, the results, the discussion, etc. These sections should be numbered except for the abstract and the key words. The numbering starts from the introduction, as follows:

1. Main section.
 - 1.1. Sub section of the main section.
 - 1.1.1. Another sub-section of the main sub-section.

A very important note:

Papers submitted according to the guidelines mentioned above must not exceed 20 pages including figures, tables, references and all sections. For more than 20 pages, the researcher will pay 25 Egyptian pounds (twenty five Egyptian pounds) for every page that exceeds the number of pages required.
